Index

The S&P 500® Index is an unmanaged index of 500 widely held stocks that is generally considered representative of the U.S. stock market. Investors cannot invest directly in an index and unmanaged index returns do not reflect any fees, expenses or sales charges.

Definitions

The price-to-earnings (P/E) ratio compares a company's share price with its earnings per share (EPS). Trailing 12 Months Price-to-Earnings is the price of a stock divided by its earnings per share over the past twelve months. The Forward 12 month P/E Ratio is a current stock's price over its predicted earnings per share for the next fiscal year.

Weighted-average market capitalization arranges the fund's holdings from highest to lowest by total market value and then by its percentage of the fund's total net assets.

Median market cap is the midpoint of the range of market caps of the stocks held by a fund.

Dividend yield is a ratio that demonstrates a company's annual dividends relative to its shares' market price. A weighted average dividend yield is the asset-weighted average of the dividend yields of all the stocks within a portfolio, calculated by taking an asset-weighted average of each stock's individual dividend yield to determine the overall portfolio's dividend income as a percentage of the total value of the stocks in the portfolio.

The **price-to-book (P/B) ratio** compares a company's market value to its book value, which is the value of all its assets minus its liabilities, helping investors identify undervalued stocks.

The **Price to Sales ratio** is a formula used to measure the total value that investors place on the company in comparison to the total revenue generated by the business. It is calculated by dividing the share price by the sales per share.

Active Share is a measure of the percentage of stock holdings in a portfolio that differs from the benchmark index.

The **30-Day SEC Yield** is computed under an SEC standardized formula based on net income earned over the past 30 days. It is a "subsidized" yield, which means it includes contractual expense reimbursements, and it would be lower without those reimbursements.

The **Unsubsidized 30-Day SEC Yield** is computed under an SEC standardized formula based on net income earned over the past 30 days. It excludes contractual expense reimbursements, resulting in a lower yield.
